# SUPERMARKET – Stockholm Independent Art Fair gathers 62 galleries in converted cruise ship terminal

On 14–17 October SUPERMARKET – Stockholm Independent Art fair will bring new life to Birka Cruises's former passenger terminal next to city hub Slussen. In Stadsgårdsterminalen's spacious halls turnstiles, waiting areas and customs office are replaced with an ambitious and bustling programme of over 60 artist-run initiatives, performance art, seminars, artist talks – and more. The press viewing with accompanying brunch will take place on 13 October at 11am, and will also be streamed live.

For the first time Supermarket will welcome **126 Artist-Run Gallery** (Galway, Ireland), one of the longest-running artist-run organisations in Ireland. The returning Irish exhibitor **Ormston House** (Limerick, Ireland) will exhibit 'Feminist Supermarket' by Ciara Barker, exploring the illusory nature of self-image. From the heart of Paris comes **AYN Gallery** with a solo exhibition by Amina Zoubir, whose deliberate deconstruction of colonial images breaks with their historical context and puts in perspective eroticised depictions sanctioned by past colonial rule.

From Central and Eastern Europe the art fair will host spaces such as **Camera** (Cluj-Napoca, Romania), **PHOTOPORT** (Bratislava, Slovakia) and **35m2** (Prague, Czech Republic), who will tune up their site-specific installation with live karaoke happenings.

Some of the overseas exhibitors include Gallery **Niigata Eya** (Niigata, Japan), who will introduce contemporary Japanese painters Hiroshi Kurita, sinzow and Momo Hasuike in a journey to recreate the specific atmosphere of the exhibition space in Niigata. **OFF-SITE** (Taipei, Taiwan), will present 'The Bridge Hole', an ongoing collaborative project developed with a network of anthropologists and artists. From Iran will arrive interdisciplinary artist-run platform **Paadmaan Projects**, with a selection of delicately crafted artists' books – which is also the theme in **Royal Canadian Academy of Arts** (Ottawa, Canada) exhibition.

For those international exhibitors who cannot travel to Sweden due to the prolonged entry ban, Supermarket 2021 is proud to introduce '**foster galleries**'. Foster gallery is a unique concept of international collaboration where Swedish exhibitors 'adopt' their international counterpart to help assist in installing and overseeing their booth of digital or shipped artworks.

In collaboration with the **Embassy of Switzerland in Sweden** we will present the **Swiss Hub**, with Swiss exhibitors, talks and performances, featuring **body&soul** (Geneva), **espace libre Visarte** and **Lumpen Station** (Biel/Bienne), **Sonnenstube** (Lugano), **Voltage** (Basel) and **Window of FAME** (Zürich).

Swedish exhibitors include **Molekyl Gallery** (Malmö), **Galleri Lars Palm** (Sandviken) and **AllArtNow** (Stockholm). For the first time art platform and online art magazine **C-print** will take part in Supermarket with the exhibition 'The Aesthetics of the Psyche' showing emerging artists Ebba Alling, Wilma Harju and Iris Hautaniemi. Also participating is newly formed artist-run initiative **Best Before Collective**, which is the tangible manifestation of the summer course 'Artist-run: practice and theory' at Konstfack University of Arts, Crafts and Design in Stockholm. The course is part of EU project *Artist-Run Network Europe*, and led by artist-run space Candyland.

In addition to the main exhibition visitors will be able to experience satellite shows hosted by local artist-run initiatives around the city, including **Duo Contradiction**, **Fylkingen**, **Fiberspace Gallery**, **Flat Octopus** (this year based at Färgfabriken), **Galleri Nos**, **Grafiska Sällskapet** and **ID:I Galleri**.
